# Why Health Matters

The health of a network determines its ability to bear fruit that lasts.

The Issue Network Health Assessment exists to help catalysts and your teams reflect prayerfully on the state of your network and discern what the Spirit may be inviting you to nurture next.

This process is not evaluative but formative – an opportunity to pause, celebrate, and re-root in God’s calling.

As the International Student Ministry [ISM] Issue Network participates in this growth reflection, the focus is on deepening vitality, strengthening connections, and extending impact.

Health, in this context, is not static but dynamic: a continuous process of tending the soil, pruning where needed, and rejoicing in new growth.



# Understanding the Report

Each assessment question was rated on a 1–5 scale, producing average scores for each area of health. These scores correspond to stages of health that are relevant to ISM's size and growth stage, and are:



**(Your top 3 scores)**

Flourishing and healthy



**(Your middle 6 scores)**

Active growth, but with room for strengthening



**(Your bottom 3 scores)**

Fragile or underdeveloped, requiring renewed focus

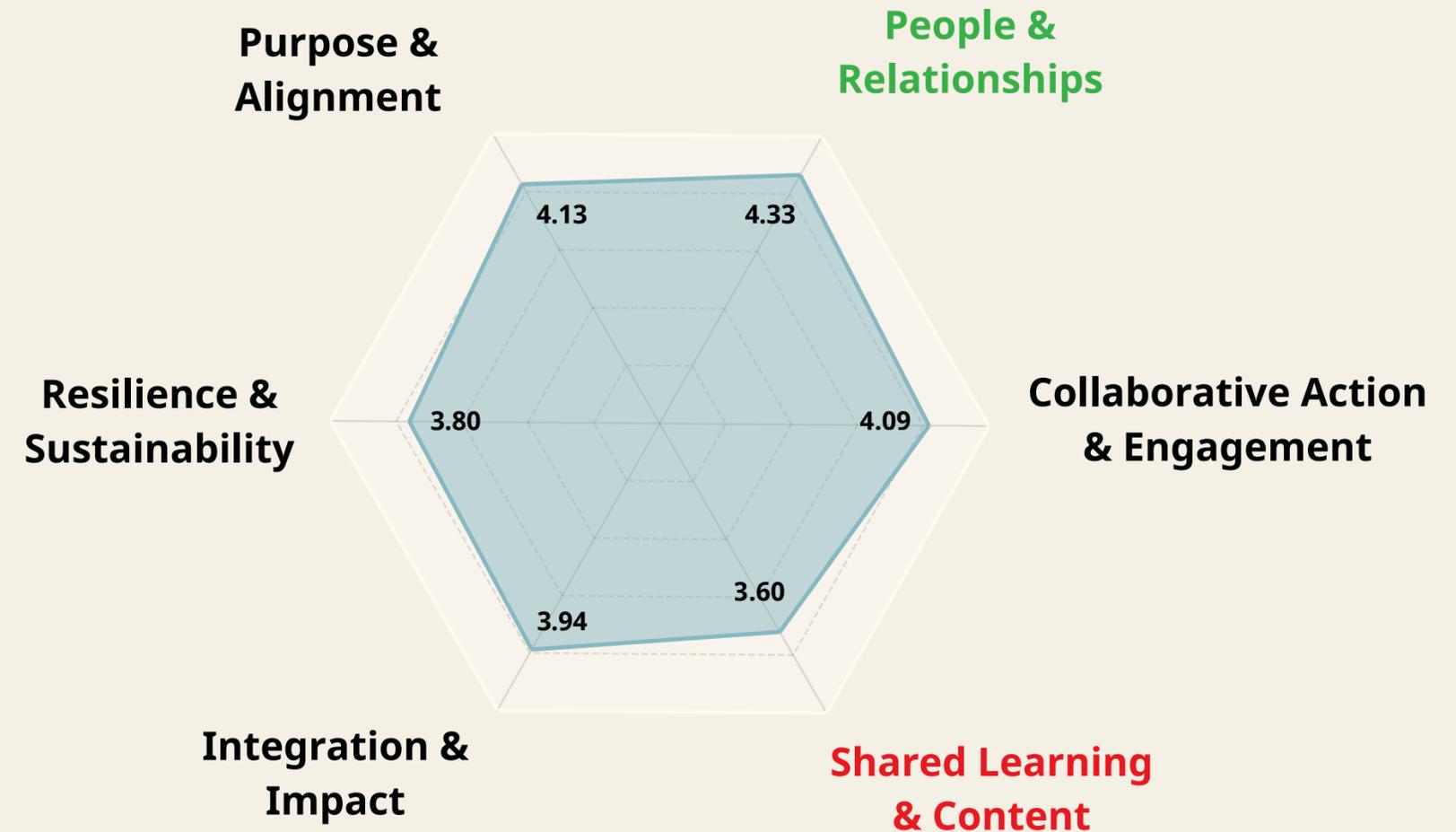
# Assessment Summary

## Overall Network Health Status

ISM shows encouraging growth, supported by relational unity and global diversity. However, uneven content development, limited resourcing, and modest external influence continue to restrict momentum. Prioritising cultivating shared learning pathways and amplifying collective wisdom will help move the network toward greater effectiveness.

## Encouragement

*Clarity of purpose gives direction; when your vision is Spirit-led and shared, the network grows with unity and confidence.*

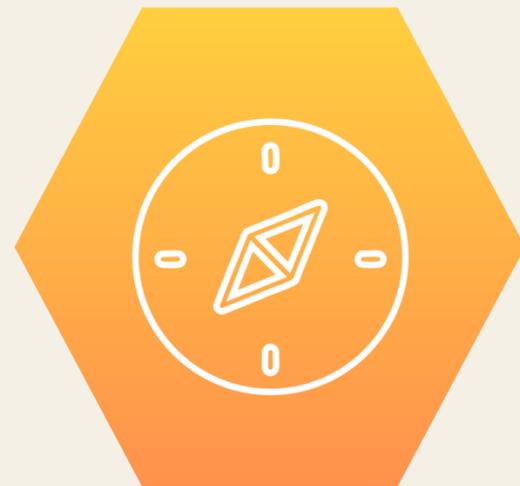


# Additional Reflections

### Reflection

# Additional Reflections



## Conflict Resolution

If a disagreement arose, most envision **healthy dialogue** would ensue, though a few are **uncertain** or expect **stalling** – indicating room for growth in governance clarity and trust.



## Network Diversity

Diversity in the network is mostly **cultural/ ethnic**, although **geographic** representation as well as **gender** diversity is also recognised. There is a need to diversify across **theological**, **generational** and, if appropriate, **professional** lines.

# Collaborative Engagement

The degree to which the network fosters participation, trusting partnerships marked by shared initiatives, mutual support, and unified pursuit of its mission.

## Reflection

Collaboration within the network is strong, shaped by deep trust, shared identity, and Spirit-led partnership. A clear leadership core fosters unity and momentum, though broader participation in planning and more consistent joint initiatives would strengthen collective ownership and extend the fruit of your collaboration.

## Encouragement

Your relational strength is a gift, with unity being fertile ground for deeper collaboration. The next step is connection – ensuring all voices are heard, and planning for joint projects.

## Encouragement

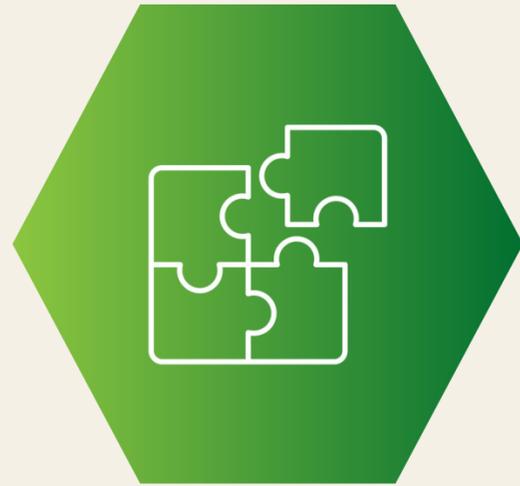
Your communication carries warmth and connection. The next step is regularity – establishing simple communication rhythms, ensuring inclusivity, and clearer vision messaging.

# Content & Training

Does the network equip others through quality, theologically grounded resources and training that meet real missional needs in diverse contexts?

## Reflection

Although meaningful resources exist, content creation and cultural relevance remains uneven. Limited reach and inconsistent storytelling reduce impact. Strengthening biblically rooted content, diversifying formats, and systematising story-sharing will broaden learning and better serve the global church.

## Encouragement

The desire for influential content production is visible. The next step is expansion – refining content, widening distribution, and capturing stories more consistently.

# Thought Leadership

The extent of the network's contribution to biblically faithful, Spirit-led insight that shapes global mission thinking and guides others in their practice.

## Reflection

Thought leadership remains limited in visibility and reach. Invitations to contribute externally are occasional, resources rarely extend beyond internal circles, and collective discernment lacks consistency. You have valuable insights to offer. Lean into wider platforms, share resources more broadly, and deepen shared discernment to strengthen your global voice.

## The Network's Voice

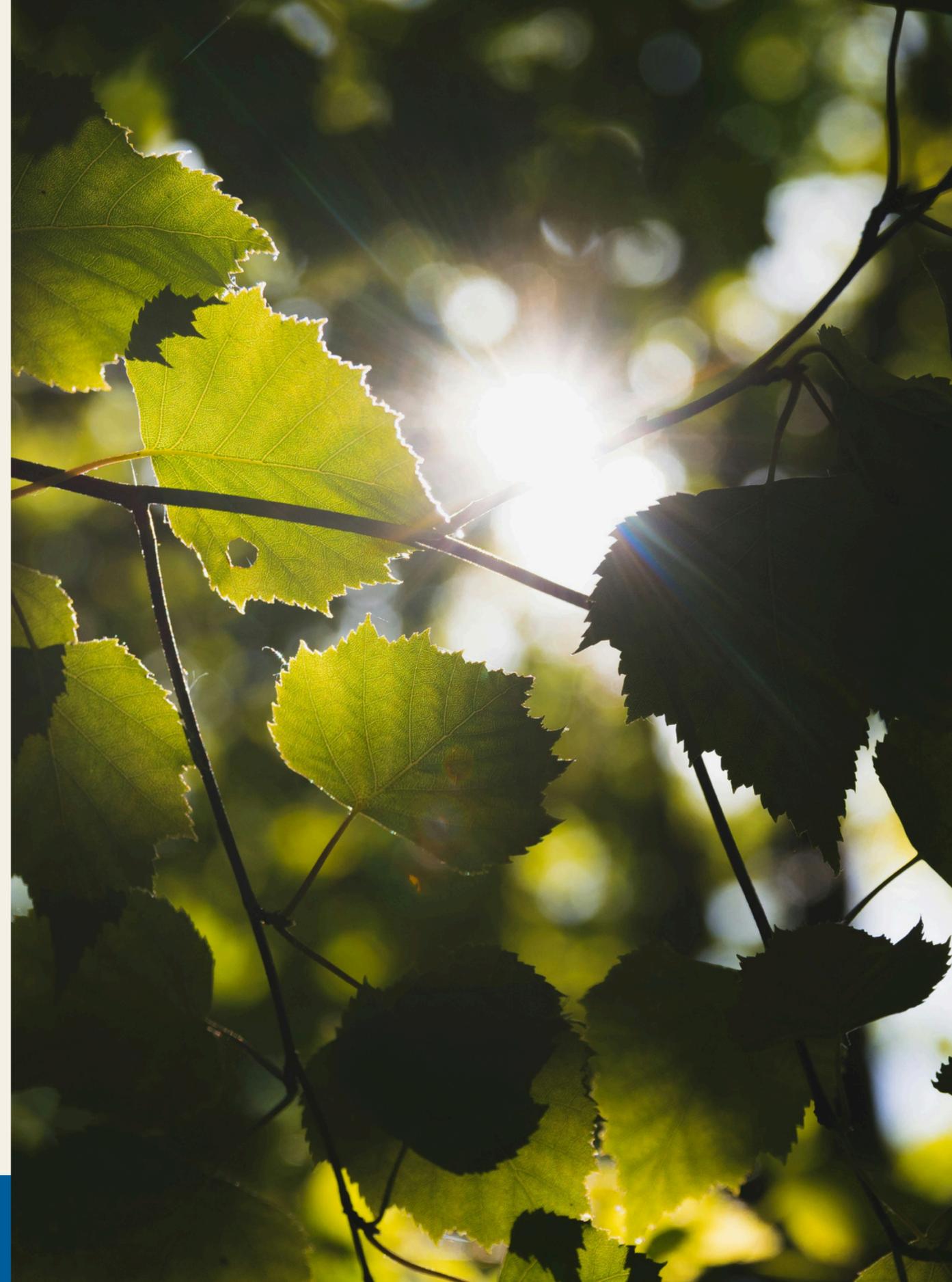
Most judge ISM's voice as only **occasionally heard** or **mostly internal**, while some see it as **emerging but growing**.

# Missional Impact

The degree to which the network makes a meaningful spiritual and strategic difference in fulfilling its mission.

## Reflection

Missional impact is evident through inspiring stories and visible community transformation, yet assessment remains uneven. While testimonies highlight God’s work, limited data collection and inconsistent tracking make it difficult to see the network’s full reach. Strengthening systems for metrics will deepen insight and inspire even greater mission impact.

## Encouragement

You’re already making a gospel difference. By strengthening simple systems to track outcomes and consistently share stories, you’ll deepen clarity and celebrate God’s work.

## Reflection

## Encouragement

The most prevalent impact is **personal transformation, missional awareness, and new partnerships**. ISM bringing **community transformation** and having **cultural influence** were rated low.

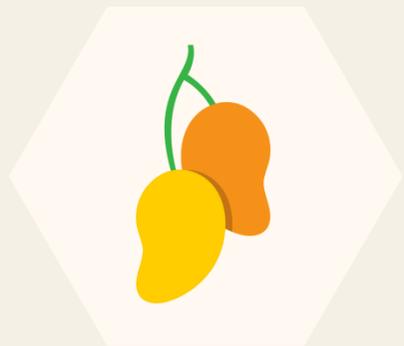


## Innovation Culture

## Reflection

A generous culture of sharing strengthens the network, yet limited time, funding, and structured support constrain long-term capacity. Inconsistent investment in emerging leaders and insufficient resourcing highlight the need for more intentional planning, broader mobilisation, and clearer systems to sustain ongoing growth.

## Encouragement

Your open-handed generosity lays a strong foundation. The next step is sustainability – strengthening how financial, human, and operational assets are mobilised and maintained.

## Encouragement

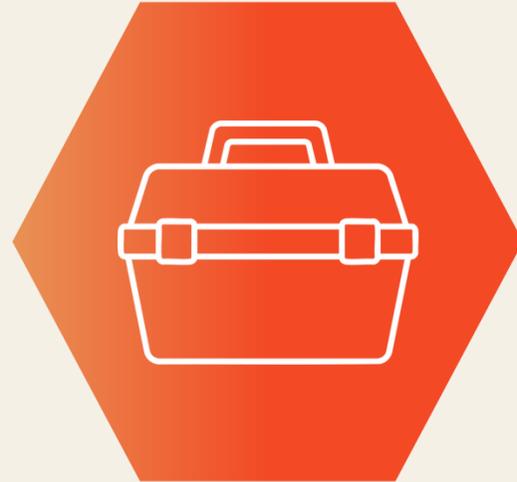
Your foundations are strong. Keep nurturing local ownership and coordination across regions to help new initiatives flourish with greater consistency, clarity, and shared support.

## Promote Missional Insights

Promote your work through accessible events, platforms, or publications.



## Assess Resource Needs

Develop a rhythm for regularly identifying and addressing resource needs.

## Invest in Emerging Leaders

Prioritise investment in the growth and development of younger leaders.

## Mobilise Network Resources

Invite members to contribute time, skills, and finances to sustain the network's mission.
