Why Health Matters

The health of a network determines its ability to bear fruit that lasts.

The Issue Network Health Assessment exists to help catalysts and your teams reflect prayerfully on the state of your network and discern what the Spirit may be inviting you to nurture next.

This process is not evaluative but formative – an opportunity to pause, celebrate, and re-root in God’s calling.

As the Children-at-Risk Issue Network participates in this growth reflection, the focus is on deepening vitality, strengthening connections, and extending impact.

Health, in this context, is not static but dynamic: a continuous process of tending the soil, pruning where needed, and rejoicing in new growth.



Understanding the Report

Each assessment question was rated on a 1–5 scale, producing average scores for each area of health. These scores correspond to stages of health that are relevant to Children-at-Risk’s size and growth stage, and are:



(Your top 3 scores)

Flourishing and healthy



(Your middle 6 scores)

Active growth, but with room for strengthening



(Your bottom 3 scores)

Fragile or underdeveloped, requiring renewed focus

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Clarity of purpose gives direction; when your vision is Spirit-led and shared, the network grows with unity and confidence.

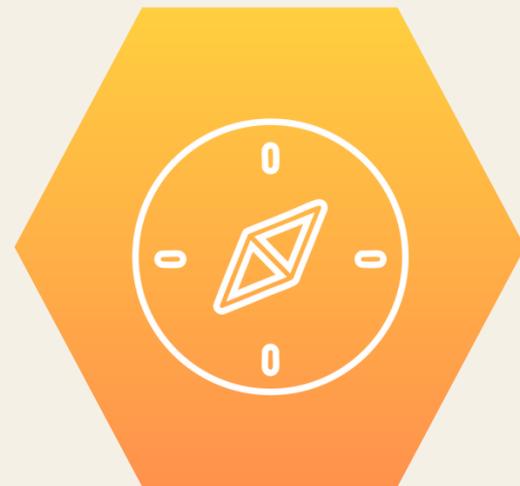


Additional Reflections

Vision Metaphors

The most common imagery was a map 🌐, but a seedling and a bridge were also identified. 🌱🌉
This suggests openness to growth and connection, though also ambiguity as to direction.

Leadership & Governance

The effectiveness, integrity, and structure of the network's leadership – how leaders model Christlikeness, provide direction, share decision-making, and uphold good governance.

Your leadership provides good soil for growth. Clearer governance structures and sharing responsibility are the next steps to grow with confidence and cohesion.

Conflict Resolution

If a disagreement arose, everyone envisions **healthy dialogue** – indicating strong relational trust within the network.



Network Diversity

Diversity in the network is mostly **geographic** and across **gender** lines, although representation of **cultural/ethnic** diversity is also recognised. There is a need to have more **generational** inclusivity and to diversify across **theological** perspectives.

Collaborative Engagement

The degree to which the network fosters participation, trusting partnerships marked by shared initiatives, mutual support, and unified pursuit of its mission.

Collaboration within the network is warm – marked by growing partnerships, relational trust, and diverse contribution to strategy. Yet engagement remains uneven, with unclear membership participation and inconsistent follow-through. Intentional, shared projects will help collaboration mature into consistent, sustainable action.

Encouragement

Relational trust is strong. The next step is clarity – defining your membership base and launching collaborative projects that invite wider participation and shared ownership.



True collaboration is born from trust; when members serve one another, and shared mission flourishes beyond individual strength.





Communication

The effectiveness of communication within the network (between members and leadership) and to external stakeholders (to the broader Lausanne Movement, church, and public).

Reflection

Communication shows warmth, yet regularity and mutual exchange are limited. While platforms support broad participation, irregular updates and limited two-way dialogue weaken unity. Strengthening communication frequency, feedback channels, and reinforcing spiritual vision would deepen engagement across the network.

Encouragement

Your communication foundations are in place. The next step is depth – increasing rhythm and dialogue to nurture shared understanding and stronger relational unity.

However, limited distribution, inconsistent learning rhythms, and irregular storytelling reduce impact. Broadening formats and strengthening shared learning story-sharing will extend reach and deepen formation.

Encouragement

You are producing rich, contextually relevant resources. The next step is accessibility – broaden reach through diverse formats, regular learning practices, and intentional storytelling.

The Network's Voice

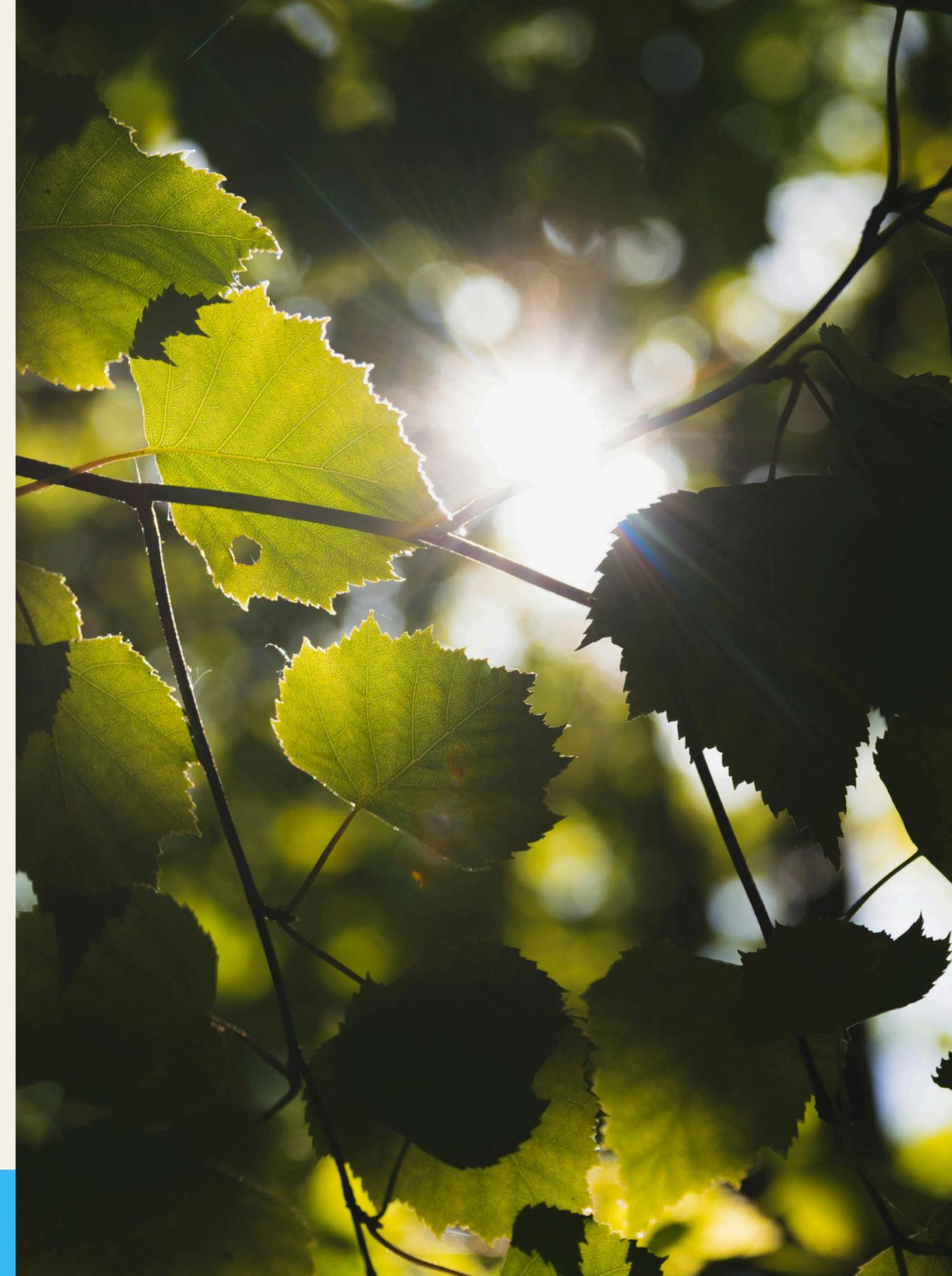
Most judge Children-at-Risk's voice as **emerging but growing**, while one sees it as **only occasionally heard**.

Innovation Culture

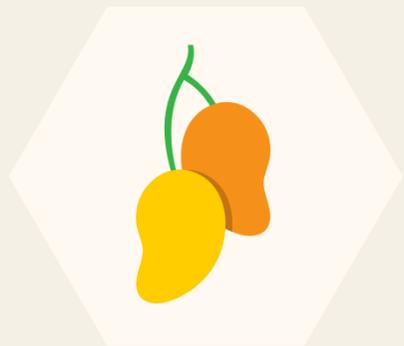
Most common responses:

Reflection

The network demonstrates generous collaboration and trustworthy stewardship, creating a strong relational foundation. However, limited time, funding, and capacity constrain future growth. More consistent resource assessment and intentional planning will ensure sustainability, strengthen execution, and support the network's long-term effectiveness.

Encouragement

You are stewarding resources faithfully. The next step is planning – mobilising broader time and funding support will help stabilise capacity and effectiveness.

Define and track both spiritual and strategic outcomes for your initiatives.

Identify Impact Drivers

Annual Vision Alignment

Annually reflect on how your work advances Lausanne's vision and your network's purpose.



Communication

Coordinate Communication Efforts

Appoint someone to help coordinate and strengthen communication efforts.

Maintain Clear Channels

Use consistent and clear channels to keep members informed and engaged.

Share Vision Regularly

Schedule regular sharing of your network's vision and updates with members and the wider church.

Plan for regular communal prayer and spiritual reflection in the network calendar.

Embed Scripture Engagement

A Collaborative Foundation

"Our current focus is family strengthening, child protection, trauma and mental health, and child participation... to curate research, advocate, and catalyse action."

Clear priorities guide the network's work, with a commitment to listening, empowering children, and mobilising the church.

Identified Growth Points

"We need to widen our pool of global leaders and engage younger leaders... and we lack constant communication with our members"
