Why Health Matters

The health of a network determines its ability to bear fruit that lasts.

The Issue Network Health Assessment exists to help catalysts and your teams reflect prayerfully on the state of your network and discern what the Spirit may be inviting you to nurture next.

This process is not evaluative but formative – an opportunity to pause, celebrate, and re-root in God’s calling.

As the Jewish Evangelism Issue Network participates in this growth reflection, the focus is on deepening vitality, strengthening connections, and extending impact.

Health, in this context, is not static but dynamic: a continuous process of tending the soil, pruning where needed, and rejoicing in new growth.



Understanding the Report

Each assessment question was rated on a 1–5 scale, producing average scores for each area of health. These scores correspond to stages of health that are relevant to Jewish Evangelism’s size and growth stage, and are:

Flourishing and healthy



(Your middle 6 scores)

Active growth, but with room for strengthening



(Your bottom 3 scores)

Fragile or underdeveloped, requiring renewed focus



Clarity of purpose gives direction; when your vision is Spirit-led and shared, the network grows with unity and confidence.




Additional Reflections

People & Relationships

Christlike leadership and inclusive, polycentric community with shared values





Leadership & Governance

The effectiveness, integrity, and structure of the network's leadership – how leaders model Christlikeness, provide direction, share decision-making, and uphold good governance.

Clear, adaptable governance supports accountable decision-making. Strengthening consistency in relational care and embracing further diversity will sustain a flourishing leadership environment.

Encouragement

Your leadership culture is strong and spiritually grounded. The next step is broadening connections and consistent relational care to sustain unity and long-term health.

The network fosters genuine belonging and mutual respect, yet inclusion remains inconsistent and largely informal. Under-represented voices and younger leaders are welcomed but not systematically developed. Creating structured pathways for contribution and mentoring will deepen participation, broaden representation, and strengthen long-term relational health.

Encouragement

Members feel a deep sense of belonging. The next step is intentionality – mentoring younger and underrepresented leaders, ensuring participation in shaping the network's future.



When every culture, generation, and voice is valued, the network reflects the fullness of Christ's body in mission.



Additional Reflections



Conflict Resolution

If a disagreement arose, most envision **healthy dialogue**, though several are uncertain about how it would be handled – indicating relational goodwill exists, but process clarity is needed.



Network Diversity

Although there was a wide range of responses, diversity in the network is mostly identified as **theological**, although representation of **cultural/ethnic** as well as **gender** diversity is also recognised. There is a need to diversify across **professional** lines.

Trusting partnerships and clear
communication, upholding unity





Collaborative Engagement

The degree to which the network fosters participation, trusting partnerships marked by shared initiatives, mutual support, and unified pursuit of its mission.

Collaboration within the network shows healthy momentum, grounded in a clear leadership core, warm relationships, and emerging mission-driven partnerships. Yet participation in planning remains uneven. Strengthening engagement, broadening inclusion, and deepening trust-building rhythms will help collaboration mature into shared ownership.

Encouragement

Your growing partnerships are encouraging. Strengthen collaboration by inviting broader input and creating simple, consistent ways for all voices to contribute meaningfully.



True collaboration is born from trust; when members serve one another, and shared mission flourishes beyond individual strength.

Encouragement


Strong relational communication is evident. The next step is enhancing two-way dialogue and clarifying vision to help every member feel more aligned and engaged.

There is a strong sense of collaborative potential within the network. Most people could name 3 people they could collaborate with on a shared initiative.

Information flows mainly through Email, with limited use of WhatsApp – reflecting accessible communication.

Does the network equip others through quality, theologically grounded resources and training that meet real missional needs in diverse contexts?

Your resources are theologically rich and valuable. The next step is accessibility – strengthening distribution, and sharing stories more consistently will inspire a broader community.

Most judge Jewish Evangelism's voice as **only occasionally heard**, while others see it as **emerging but growing**, and a few as **clear and respected**.


There were 2 responses believing Jewish Evangelism's voice is **mostly internal** or **not yet visible**.

Missional impact is evident, yet your ability to demonstrate your full influence is limited by informal data collection and irregular reflection and connection to Lausanne’s broader vision. Having systems for measurement, storytelling, and regular evaluation will enhance insight, deepen alignment with vision, and amplify shared encouragement.

Encouragement

You are bearing lasting gospel fruit. The next step is implementing simple systems for measuring impact so your collective fruit becomes clearer and more widely encouraging.

Yet spiritual discernment is not always fully integrated into decisions, and feedback remains irregular. Strengthening habits of timely response, shared learning, and Spirit-led reflection will deepen innovation and sustain adaptive effectiveness.

Encouragement

Your openness to adapt is a gift. The next step is creating simple rhythms for shared discernment and regular feedback to help innovation grow into a collective, Spirit-led practice.



Spirit-led innovation keeps the network fresh – ready to respond with courage, creativity, and faith to changing mission needs.

Network Impact

The most prevalent impact is **missional awareness, new partnerships, and personal transformation**, although there were mixed views as to Jewish Evangelism bringing **change within the church**. There is least impact in **transforming communities**.



Innovation Culture

Most common responses:

- 🚲 Bicycle – Slow but steady, powered by a few
- 🚗 SUV – Reliable and adaptable, but lacks speed
- 🚣 Canoe – Collaborative, but drifting

The network sees itself as relational, steady and dependable, yet driven by a small core and limited in pace and direction.

Resources and generational continuity, ensuring longevity and multiplication beyond the network

Diversify Leadership Representation

Review your leadership team to ensure it reflects the diversity of your focus and context.

Invite Underrepresented Groups

Identify voices from underrepresented groups and proactively invite them into the network.

Mentor Emerging Leaders

Devise a plan to mentor and empower emerging leaders from diverse backgrounds.



Develop Emerging Leaders

Identify younger leaders within your network and devise a plan to develop them.

Form New Initiatives

Form working groups to launch new initiatives or regional expressions.

Encourage Network Replication

Support and celebrate efforts to replicate the network's vision in new contexts.



Track Strategic Outcomes

Define and track both spiritual and strategic outcomes for your initiatives.

Evaluate Holistic Impact

Evaluate impact using both qualitative stories and quantitative data.

Annual Vision Alignment

Annually reflect on how your work advances Lausanne's vision and your network's purpose.
